ur D of E Scheme is growing in popularity, with 20 Bronze Certificates and 10 Bronze Awards completed by our Resilience students and 34 students in total completing their Bronze Award. More Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards are in progress.

60 Resilience students are now enrolled on either Bronze or Silver Awards, with 67 students in total on Bronze, 42 on Silver and 10 on Gold. 12 staff members are now trained as leaders.

Our Silver qualifying expedition was held during the September heatwave, from Woodbridge to Walberswick.
