66There was not a single pupil who would not recommend the school to a friend moving to the area" Our purpose is to develop our youngest students into independent, reflective and able learners. By providing a varied curriculum we aim to build upon the skills and experiences that our students bring from primary school by offering them a wide range of opportunities to enrich their outcomes inside and outside the classroom. We aim to prepare students for lifelong learning within a nurturing, yet mature framework.

Year 7 have their own pastoral area within the school, where the Head of Year 7 is based. This area works as a hub for our youngest students, a place they can come to during social times. We are also lucky enough to have a number of designated rooms solely for Year 7 students to use during break and lunchtimes to complete homework, meet with friends and relax knowing this area is specifically for Year 7 students only. These rooms are all supervised by Student Leaders and members of staff. We understand that moving up from primary school can be an exciting time for any student and the pastoral area provides them with the security of somewhere familiar and supportive whilst they get used to being part of a bigger community.

The pastoral team is wholly committed to providing the support and care that your child needs to develop as a young person and learner. The Leader of Learning in Year 7 is a non-teaching member of staff and this gives a greater opportunity to work with individuals in the year group with relation to academic, extra-curricular and personal issues. Oversight of Year 7 and 8 lies with the Vice Principal, Mrs Orrin.

To prepare students in Years 7 & 8 as independent, able and reflective learners, we have carefully designed our curriculum to give them the best start to their secondary education. Students will have termly individual learning reflection opportunities, which will allow them to consider their progress over time and to review and set new targets to help them to make as much progress as possible.

Extra-curricular activities for Year 7 are wide ranging. Sports activities are available most lunchtimes and subjects also offer their own opportunities for students. For Year 7 we also run 'WOW!' or 'What's on Wednesday', which is an opportunity all year 7 students get involved in. On Wednesdays the school day ends early to allow students to take part in 'WOW!'. A wide range of activities are on offer including rock climbing, nail art, first aid, baking, drama and sports. Students are able to access a number of different activities throughout the year, with the option of changing to a different activity each half term.

Copleston's curriculum

At Copleston High School our curriculum equips our students with the knowledge, skills and attributes to become confident and proficient life-long learners. Not only does our curriculum provide a solid foundation for progression to Post-16 and Higher Education, it offers our students a wide range of opportunities to develop a real love for learning. There are a range of enrichment opportunities and a very strong focus on acquisition and mastery of the key skills of literacy and numeracy. Our curriculum also actively promotes the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our students. In addition, our students gain a clear understanding of the fundamental British values of democracy, rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect for, and tolerance of, those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith.

The curriculum is broad and balanced with personalised pathways that will enrich and prepare students for adult life.

The curriculum structure is driven by Copleston High School's commitment to delivering educational excellence by providing a wide range of subjects and opportunities that will create a desire for learning. The school's curriculum follows statutory requirements and the requirements of the National Curriculum. 65 minute lessons provide pace and challenge across the curriculum areas. Students are taught in a combination of sets and ability teaching groups. All students follow the National Curriculum core and foundation subjects. Students will spend two years in Key Stage 3 and three years in Key Stage 4. The curriculum is flexible and is able to support personalised pathways.

During the first term in Year 7, students are assessed regularly and comprehensive, continued monitoring and assessment ensures that appropriate needs are identified and addressed. With a clear focus on literacy and numeracy across the key stage, the curriculum and timetable provides a degree of flexibility to accommodate individual needs. An embedded PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) is delivered through timetabled lessons at Key Stage 3. Additional English support, and additional Maths support, is also provided to those students requiring "catch up" in these areas.

Most students will learn one language from a choice of French or Spanish.

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Home learning and homework provide our students with opportunities to develop valuable independent learning skills. The home learning tasks are varied and include: questions to check understanding and consolidate learning; research-based activities, and individual/group projects. Home learning tasks are set daily and parents are encouraged to take an active interest in these.

Homework is set via Satchel, our online platform. There parents, staff and students can all monitor progress around it.


Our students are also offered a wide range of extra-curricular activities. In addition to after-school clubs in curriculum subjects such as Science. Drama and Music, we offer a wide range of sports clubs such as netball, football, rugby and basketball. We also offer a unique What's On Wednesday (WOW) programme where our students can undertake enrichment opportunities between 2.10-4.10pm every Wednesday afternoon. These sessions are very varied ranging from gardening clubs to many types of sports activities. Further to this we also run a nationally renowned Basketball Academy where our students are trained by professional basketball coaches. The Head Coach has been named the National Basketball League Division 2 "Coach of the Year".

We have a fully equipped gym and fitness suite which our students get to use regularly. We are also

fortunate in having a school garden and allotment with greenhouses, polytunnels and raised beds for growing vegetables.

Our students take part in a wide range of competitions such as debating, music and drama productions and also go on numerous trips within the country and beyond.

Our school motto 'Achieving Success Together' underpins all that we do here at Copleston. Effort and determination are two qualities that we value above all others. We will reward our students for showing these qualities and we will support them to become as successful as possible.

Pastoral care & student progress

At Copleston we believe that it is important that our young people feel happy, supported and cared for in order to achieve their best in the classroom. Our Pastoral System provides the support and guidance that students need from Year 7 right the way through until Year 13.

Our Pastoral Team is made up of both teaching and non-teaching staff. Each morning students meet their Form Tutor for registration and ordinarily, a student's Form Tutor will stay with them as they progress through the school, building a positive relationship. Form Tutors monitor student's school uniform, attendance and their overall academic achievement. The Tutor will also discuss behaviour with the members of their form group.

Each year group is led by a Leader of Learning who coordinates the team Form Tutors, ensuring that high standards are maintained within the year group. They also have an overview of the academic progress made by all students in the year group. If it is felt that additional support is needed for specific students, this is implemented.

Students may be mentored at various times during their school career in order for them to reach their potential; this may be by older students, their Form Tutor, members of their Year Team, or by Reading Mentor, who give up their time to work with our students

A further important part of Pastoral support is the Attendance Team who monitor absence and punctuality. They also work closely with our Education Welfare Officer (EWO) who comes to the school each week to check student attendance across all year groups.

As well as members of Copleston staff we also have support from external agencies whose staff are specialists in their field. For example, the School Nurse holds a drop-in once a week during lunchtime within the school and we also provide a counselling service on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. Our counsellor takes referrals from students and their parents as well as members of the Pastoral Team. Counselling is completely confidential, meaning that information is not disclosed to staff, family members or friends. The school also has a Well-Being Consultant that works with individual students, groups of students and families.

Copleston is school which promotes a positive, caring attitude amongst its students and staff whilst focusing on effective learning. Students

are expected to follow the school rules at all times. Appropriate attitudes to learning and good behaviour are nurtured by reinforcing and rewarding good behaviour. The school has a strong rewards culture. Termly Achievement Assemblies and Celebration Evenings provide examples of what the school does to reward its students.
